Week 6: The Respiratory System Name:

Concepts Taught:  - The respiratory system includes the nose, trachea, and lungs.  - The nasal cavity is filled with tiny hairs and mucus. These help filter air of impurities such as dust, viruses, pollen etc.  - Inside the lungs are tiny air tubes called bronchioles and tiny air sacs called alveoli.  - The diaphragm is the muscle mostly responsible for breathing.
Vocabulary: <a href="mucus">mucus</a> : a sticky substance found in the nasal cavity that keeps bad substances out of the lungs. <a href="mucus">bronchioles</a> : are tiny, thin-walled tubes that carry air to where the lungs can finally use it. <a href="mucus">alveoli</a> : tiny sacs in the lungs where oxygen is put into the blood and carbon dioxide is reomved.
